REFERENCE: 2008 Street Projects

The Street Department work crews are scheduled to complete the following 2007 Street Projects by the end of March 2008:

- 1. Blaney Hill Road Reconstruct road to 24' asphalt w/ 6' gravel shoulders from Stone Road to Skinner Hill Rd with overlay of exist pavement to western city limits.
- 2. Richland Hills Road Overlay Hilton Dr. to Richland Hills Cove.
- 3. Siebenmorgen-Courtway-Freyaldenhoven Roundabout Construct new box culvert (3 barrels 12' x 5' box culvert) under Siebenmorgen Road & complete west leg of Roundabout.

Following this work they will be available to begin a new project. It would help us if the street overlay list could be finalized soon allowing us to perform the preparation work for the overlays during the wet winter and spring months and make more staff available for street projects during the summer.

2008 STREET FUND PROJECTS

I have attached a summary sheet listing several street overlay and street reconstruction projects. Our budget includes \$473,000 for street overlays and reconstruction. The following projects in my opinion need to be funded to properly address the maintenance of the street infrastructure:

- 1. Farris Bruce Roundabout \$80,000 The existing four way stop at this location backs up several blocks during peak hour traffic. The roundabout should allow traffic to move freely thru this intersection.
- 2. Donaghey Street Overlay Washington to Meadowlake \$62,000 The existing pavement along this section of street is failing as can be seen by the cracking section of asphalt and the depressions developing along the vehicle wheel path. The heavy volume of traffic will destroy the integrity of the existing pavement if the street is not repaved soon. The strength and durability of the street is dependent on the thickness of sound asphalt pavement. If the pavement is allowed to deteriorate we will lose the strength the existing asphalt pavement provides.
- 3. **Exchange Avenue Overlay** Dave Ward to Runway \$85,000 Heavy industrial loads are causing the failure of the pavement along Exchange Ave. As described above, the overlay

is needed before the existing pavement section deteriorates further. The repairs of this road would give a more favorable impression to the current and potential industrial residents regarding the city's commitment to maintain the access to their facilities.

- access to their facilities.
 4. Commerce Street Overlay Exchange to Harkrider \$58,000 As described above heavy industrial loads are causing the failure and is needed before the existing pavement section deteriorates further. The repairs of this road would give a more favorable impression to the current and potential industrial residents regarding the city's commitment to maintain the access to their facilities.
- 5. OAK ST. STREETSCAPE Chestnut to Court \$78,834 This project would continue the sidewalk improvements along Oak street eastward to Court Street. The cost presented does not address any drainage or flooding issues. City crews would perform the work (market value of \$167,648) with the estimated cost of \$78,834 for materials and outside contractors only. Asphalt paving of this section of street is included in the estimate.
- 6. Joint County/City Projects County Judge Preston Scroggins has offered to joint venture the improvement of three roads that are generally 50% in the county and 50% in the city. The Judge has offer to perform the repairs to the subgrade and placement of crushed stone base course and pay for 50% of the asphalt paving on the following roads:
 - 1. Lower Ridge Road Victory Ln. thru East German Ln. (2,600 feet) 50% of the asphalt cost is \$33,000
 - 2. Bill Lucy Dr. along north side Simon School (2,600 feet) - 50% of the asphalt cost is \$24,000
 - 3. Middle Road East German Lane to Skunk Hollow Road -(5,000 feet) - 50% of asphalt cost is \$62,500 These roads are in poor condition and certainly need attention. This gives us an opportunity to gets these streets improved at minimal cost.

IMPACT FEE & CARTS FUNDED PROJECTS

The following projects are presently programmed for funding from non street fund sources:

- 1. Harkrider Fleming to Spruce Four lane median divided roadway with 208' diameter roundabouts at Siebenmorgen and at Winfield. The project also includes a pedestrian underpass on the north side of Siebenmorgen Road. This project is estimated to cost \$4,600,000 with 80% federal funding thru Metroplan and 20% local match. The AHTD is presently acquiring ROW for this project. The relocation of a 16" waterline must be completed before this project can get underway. It is estimated that the waterline relocation will not be completed until late fall.
- 2. <u>Tyler Street</u> Eve Lane to Willow Wind Subdivision 36' curbed street with sidewalk on south side. \$836.935 - Funded with street impact fees. Bid opening in February

- 3. Salem Road Nutter Chapel Rd. to north boundary of the "Greens @ Nutter Chapel PUD". This project is needed to prevent the further destruction of the pavement along this section of Salem or along Nutter Chapel Rd by the "Greens" construction traffic. This section of road has already been damaged by the construction traffic to the Subdivision along South Salem. The improved road will provide an appropriate western connection to the Favre Lane Project for access to Ellen Smith School and the subdivision along South Salem (Southwind, Spring Valley & Bradley Place) - The estimated cost of a 36 foot curbed street with sidewalk on one side is \$839,850. Possible funding for this project could be Prepayment of the "Greens" impact fee (\$700,000) supplemented with revenue from Sales Tax.
- 4. <u>Museum Road</u> Siebenmorgen Road to Lower Ridge Road -(1,543,959) Bid opening in late Fall (waiting on adequate accumulation of Street Impact Fee)

SALES TAX - CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Revenue from the 50% of the ½ cent sales tax is now accumulating for major street projects. The initial project approved for funding from this revenue is <u>Salem Road</u> - Meadowlake Rd. to U.S. 64 at the new I-40 interchange. The estimated cost for a 36' curbed street with sidewalk on one side is \$2,746,765. The plans are being prepared now and Right of Way acquisition needs to be completed in February so that we can open bids in early March.

Funds will be available for other corridor improvement projects by mid year. It would be desirable to proceed with the plans for the next projects in order to give the utility companies time to adjust or relocate their facilities and us time to get any right of way issues resolved.

If we focus on improvement of the intersections, we can have a significant impact on improvement of traffic flow without undertaking the major street reconstruction. Projects that would reduce congestion by adding lanes at intersection included the following:

- 1. College Avenue Salem to Hubbard (5-Lanes) (\$750,000)
- 2. College Avenue Country Club Road Possible Roundabout
 (\$400,000)
- 3. Donaghey Ave at Dave Ward (Rt. Turn Lane + Dual Left on Donaghey)
- 4. Prince Salem Intersection (add Rt. Turn Lane)
- 5. Farris Road Dave Ward to Bruce
- 6. Salem Road Dave Ward to College
- 7. College Ave Hubbard to Donaghey
- 8. Prince Salem to Western

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF PUBLIC FACILITIES BOARD OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT REVENUE BONDS (HENDRIX COLLEGE PROJECTS), IN ONE OR MORE SERIES, BY THE PUBLIC FACILITIES BOARD OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS; PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Hendrix College (the "College") has requested that the City of Conway, Arkansas Public Facilities Board (the "Board") issue Capital Improvement Revenue Bonds in an aggregate principal amount of approximately \$37,500,000 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized pursuant to the Public Facilities Board Act, Ark. Code Ann. §§ 14-137-101 to 123 (1998 Repl.; 2007 Suppl.) to issue bonds to finance educational facilities within the City of Conway; and

WHEREAS, following a public hearing before the City Council for which notice has been given in the manner required by Ark. Code Ann. § 19-9-607, the City Council has determined that the public purposes for which the Bonds are to be issued serve a proper need; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Conway, Arkansas (the "City") desires to acknowledge its approval of the College's request and the issuance of the Bonds by the Board after adoption of appropriate resolutions by the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Conway, Arkansas:

Section 1. That the issuance of the bonds by the Board in an aggregate principal amount of approximately \$37,500,000 for the purposes of financing the acquisition, construction and equipping of certain capital improvements at Hendrix College is hereby authorized. The proposed capital improvements are expected to consist primarily of (i) a portion of the cost of a building and equipping a Student Life and Technology Center, (ii) campus wide HVAC improvements, (iii) other improvements, acquisitions, fixtures and equipment incidental to (i) and (ii), and (iv) for such other capital improvements as may be requested by the College and approved by the Board (all of which are hereinafter referred to as the "Improvements").

Section 2. That this resolution is adopted for the purpose of complying with the requirements of Ark. Code Ann. § 19-9-601, et seq.

Section 3. That the provisions of this resolution are hereby declared to be separable and if any provision shall for any reason be held illegal or invalid, such holdings shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this resolution.

Section 4. The need to provide facilities for the continued growth and development of Hendrix College being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare, an emergency is hereby declared and this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

REFERENCE: Salem Road Reconstruction & Extension to Greens @ Nutter Chapel PUD

In order to improve to the access to the Greens at Nutter Chapel PUD, Rush-Hal has offered to make available to the city immediately for the improvement of Salem Road the street impact fee that would be required of their project. The impact fee for the 900 apartments would total \$693,900 (\$771/unit x 900 units).

Our preliminary estimate is \$839,350 for improving the 3,900 feet of Salem Road from Nutter Chapel Road to the north boundary of the PUD. The improvements would provide a 36 foot curbed street with sidewalk on one side.

If we do not improve either Salem or Nutter Chapel, the construction traffic associated with the 900 apartments will likely destroy the pavement on these roads.

In order to get Salem completed in time to accommodate the construction traffic we need to get the project started immediately.

To get this project moving we need approval to allow the prepayment of the street impact fee and allow that money to be spent on Salem Road. We also need authorization to proceed with the Salem Road Improvement project.

EXHIBIT A Scope of Work for Basic Services City of Conway Tucker Creek LOMR Map Correction

Attached to and made part of the Letter Agreement dated January 28, 2008 between the City of Conway (the Client) and FTN Associates, Ltd. (FTN), in respect to the Project described therein. The objectives, specific tasks, assumptions, and proposed schedule for the Project follow:

Project Objectives

The objectives of the Project are:

- 1. To compare the location of special flood hazard area subject to inundation by the 1% annual chance flood and the floodway for a portion of Tucker Creek (specifically from Hogan Lane upstream to Prince Street, approximately 2.6 mi) depicted on the current effective Faulkner County FIRM panels 05045C0278H and 05045C0279H, dated December 19, 2006, to work maps provided by FTN to the City of Conway and submitted to FEMA in 2002.
- To prepare the necessary documentation for a LOMR to incorporate proposed map correction(s) to the FEMA effective panels using the FTN work maps in areas where the work maps provide updated floodplain/floodway locations.

FTN Project Tasks

Specific project tasks are as follows:

- 1. Obtain Faulkner County, AR DFIRM database and panels from the FEMA project library.
- Perform comparison of the digital floodplain/floodway on the effective Faulkner County FIRMs and digital data prepared by FTN and submitted to FEMA and the City of Conway (FEMA Contract EMT-2001-CO-0028, Task Order 2, Faulkner County, AR FIS Restudy, 2002).
- 3. Prepare revisions including updated database based on FTN data.
- 4. Prepare annotated FIRM panels for submittal to FEMA showing the revisions.
- 5. Prepare a Letter of Map Revision application to FEMA for a mapping correction in the areas along Tucker Creek where the FTN data provided more accurate floodplain/floodway location based on current conditions and available data.
- 6. Coordination with the Client and the City of Conway throughout the course of the data review and preparation and submittal of LOMR application to FEMA, including monthly progress reports.

- 1. Begin services within one week after receipt of your acceptance of this proposal.
- 2. Prepare and submit to FEMA the LOMR application within thirty (30) days after receipt of all information needed from the FEMA library and the City of Conway.

EXHIBIT B

Standard Terms and Conditions For FTN Contracts

- d) Department stores or factories having a capacity in excess of two hundred (200) persons.

2 (e) should read: Buildings containing hazardous occupancies if located with the City.

e) Any other building containing hazardous occupancies if located within the City.

Section 2. All other parts and enumerated paragraphs in Section 2 remain intact unamended, and are in full force and effect.

Section 3. That any ordinance in conflict herewith is hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.

Section 4. That this ordinance is necessary for the protection of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of Conway, and therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall go into effect from and after its passage and approval.

2008 Uniform Bid Tabulations/Breakdown Bid Number: 2008-12

Sealed bids were opened on January 18, 2008 at 10 am at City Hall. Four bids were received. The breakdown is as follows for a new hire with the City Police Department.

- 1) Galls \$916.74
- 2) Cruse Uniforms \$1137.15
- 3) Conway Police Supply \$1204.10
- 4) Direct Police Sales \$1110.41 (Failure to meet bid specifications)

When figuring the above totals I figured what the cost to outfit a new hire would be. The reasoning behind that is the fact that in 2007, our department had to outfit 25 new hires. The cost to do so is significant. Thus the above totals include what we would purchase for a new hire of the items bid.

In 2006 our uniform bid was awarded to Galls. Galls definitely has the lowest price. They are a large mail/internet/catalog supplier. By March/April of 2006 we were already trying to figure if or how we could get out of the contract with them. What we experienced was a very difficult situation. Although their prices are very low, they charge very high shipping/handling charges on everything we order (by looking at previous invoices, we were charged anywhere from 10% to 18%). I was required to maintain a large stock of everything and we experienced a lot of items being backordered. The situation just simply did not work. A lot of times when we hire people, they are only in our building for a few days before they leave for the police academy. When they go to the academy they need 90% of their equipment. That just was not possible with Galls. We had no idea when we would receive the items ordered. Returns were also very difficult. We were responsible for return shipping which became very expensive.

In my bid specifications, I stated that "No Substitutions" would be accepted on the uniform items themselves. The bid we received from Direct Police Sales was on a completely different uniform than the one specified. We have been very happy with our current uniforms and do not wish to deviate from that. We are attempting to reach the point where all of our officers are in the same uniform. If the uniform is changed every year we will never reach that goal. So it is my recommendation that the bid from Direct Police Sales be thrown out/not considered for failing to meet bid specifications.

It is my opinion that this bid should come down to two (2) vendors, Cruse Uniforms (Little Rock) and Conway Police Supply (Conway). There was only a slight difference in price as you can see above. Conway Police Supply had the uniform bid this year (2007) and I have nothing but good things to say about them. The service we have received with them has been exceptional! On the bid submitted by Cruse Uniforms they stated

that a charge of \$7.95 would be added to all orders under \$150.00. If you factor in the fact that 42% of our invoices last year were under that dollar amount then in most cases that would raise their price/cost above Conway Police Supply. Also, they are located in Little Rock. I make numerous trips to the uniform vendor every week, and the cost of fuel to Little Rock would be significant along with my time away from the office. In addition, all new hires have to go to the vendor to be sized. It is very common for little emergencies to crop up that need to be addressed immediately. So far this year, I have had a couple of officers that needed a coat for that nights shift and I was able to send the coat down to Conway Police Supply and within minutes had all the patches/namestrips sewn onto the coat so the officer could use it immediately. That simply would not be possible if our supplier was in Little Rock.

The bottom line is without factoring in the shipping/handling charge that Cruse will impose there is only a difference in \$66.95 per new hire/complete outfitting between Conway Police Supply and Cruse. If you factor in that extra charge for Cruse, then in most cases Conway Police Supply would be cheaper. It is my recommendation that the bid be awarded to Conway Police Supply. They are a local Conway vendor (Shop Conway First), it would save me the down time and fuel of driving back and forth to Little Rock several times a week, and if you factored in the handling charge that will be imposed by Cruse, then the cost difference between the two vendors is even less.
