Mayor Castleberry,

On March 15, 2022, the newly formed 911 Consolidation Oversight Committee held its first meeting. During this meeting, I (Conway PD Assistant Chief Chris Harris) was nominated as the chairperson for the committee and Sean Canady was nominated as the secretary. One of the decisions made by the committee was that topics would be discussed by the committee then voted on. Those votes would then be presented to Judge Baker as well as yourself for approval.

On April 5, 2022, the committee met and voted on several topics:

- All monies generated from the emergency telephone service charges and funds received or allocated by the Arkansas 911 Board to the City and County shall go to the operation of the Faulkner County Emergency Operation Center. (Voted unanimously 11-0)
- If those funds are insufficient to meet the operating expenses of the system, the City of Conway and Faulkner County shall share the shortfall cost based on the percentages of their respective populations based on the most recent Census. Currently this breaks down as Conway 52% of the population and Faulkner County 48%. (Voted unanimously 11-0)
- Raise all employees' salaries to the current level of the City of Conway Communications Center employees once the consolidation is performed. (Voted unanimously 11-0)

On May 3, 2022, the committee met and had the following discussions:

- Human Resource representatives from the City of Conway and Faulkner County were present and discussed benefits packages for each entity.
- ADEM stated a grant proposal for Faulkner County regarding converting their CAD system to Southern cannot move forward without a completed and submitted plan to the State 911 Board.

On May 31, 2022, the committee met and had the following discussion:

- The committee was supposed to meet on this date and vote which entity (City of Conway or Faulkner County) would hold the budget for the Communications Center. Two of the committee members said they would abstain from the vote because they wanted to discuss all options with Communication Center employees first.
- Chief Tapley suggested to postpone the vote until June 14, 2022, to give the City and County officials the opportunity to meet with Communication employees.

On June 14, 2022, the committee met and voted on the following topic:

 All monies appropriated for the Center shall be paid into a fund and managed by the Communications Director with specific guidelines as established by the City budget process and 911 Governing Board. All procurement for the system shall be governed by the City of Conway's purchasing and procurement procedures. (Voted 7-4 in favor of City of Conway holding the budget for the center.)

It was discussed that we needed to give all the information to the Conway City Attorney as well as the County Attorney so they could begin the process of drawing up the Interlocal Agreement. For the 911 Consolidation Oversight Committee to be formally established and recognized as a governing board, the Interlocal Agreement will have to be drafted, approved and signed by Judge Baker as well as yourself, and then presented to the Conway City Council and the Faulkner County Quorum Court.

Re: **(APPEAL)** Request to rezone from R-1 to C-2 ±3.88 acres east of Bill Bell Lane at the intersection of Acuff Lane

Chris Thornton with MCMG, LLC has requested to rezone from R-1 to C-2 ±3.88 acres located east of Bill Bell Lane at the intersection of Acuff Lane. The proposed rezoning is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, which calls for single-family residential in the area. Given future use of the adjacent site, a use that would allow a transition to the existing single-family neighborhood to the intense public utility use would be compatible for the surrounding area and a good alternative to multi-family development.

Planning staff recommended approval of rezoning. While the proposed rezoning is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, the rezoning will provide a reasonable transition from the adjacent utility facility, allow for compatible use of the property, and will not likely harm adjacent property.

The Planning Commission reviewed the request at its regular meeting on May 16, 2022. After considerable public comment, the Planning Commission voted 1-6, failing the rezoning request. Mr. Thornton has elected to request appeal of the Planning Commission denial. His letter of appeal and supporting documents are included within this packet.

The City Council has two options for action:

- City Council may uphold the decision of the Planning Commission, denying the application with reasons cited regarding the potential development too great for the area.
- City Council may overturn the decision of the Planning Commission, approving the application, as amended.

Thank you for reviewing this appeal.

First, and perhaps most importantly, this project has the approval and support of the City of Conway Planning Department. What does a staff approval mean? It means that it's GOOD PLANNING. We all know these professionals have impressive planning and engineering credentials and are independent thinking and working for the best interests of the City of Conway. They are appropriately uninterested in politics. Simply, if it's good for the city, they are in favor of it. If it's not good for the city, they aren't. I'm proud that this project has the YES recommendation of the professionals in the City of Conway Planning Department.

Second, for those of you who know me and my company, you know that IF this project wasn't the best use of the land and a good fit for the area, our team wouldn't be here to request a permit. Our team has a history of providing superlative quality development, and in many cases, higher quality than is required by the city. Stonebrook Cove subdivision is a beautiful gated neighborhood of 55+ residents which has enhanced the city with its timeless craftsman architecture, its stately brick wall and elegant gated entrance...one of the few neighborhoods you'll find with a complete landscape lighting system throughout which obviates the street lights and makes the neighborhood feel safer and more comfortable at night. A newer cousin to Stonebrook Cove, Woodland Cove subdivision is another example of that same outstanding quality...We voluntarily built a beautiful brick wall there because in the end, it made the project fit our vision for quality the best.

Things that we are confident the planning staff considered in granting their support were that:

- a) Traffic mitigation is the key issue to the neighbors in this area. The proposed use will have the lowest possible traffic count vs any alternative use...much lower than if the land was used for multifamily or single family housing. The people who opposed this (all were from 1000-2000 feet away, and NONE were within view from their homes) are speaking as though this project will make traffic worse. The EXISTING zoning for approximately 21 homes will make traffic worse changing to this use will improve what they are concerned about. This may be easily verified by planning statistics, which are available through the city planners.
- b) Noise is another issue that must be considered. The noise generated by basketball goals, vehicles, home repairs, etc. will be substantially higher for 21 homes. The proposed use is the QUIETEST use of all.
- c) This tract of land is bordered on THREE SIDES by a noise, sight, and traffic nuisance. On the East, it is bordered by the intense industrial uses of Conway Corporation and Virco. The industrial

uses, as we all know, are soon to be even **greater** as Conway Corp. ramps up its use of the sewer treatment plant site there. In addition to the nuisances on the eastern border, the southern border is in the process of being ramped up by Conway Corp to be their new entrance, etc. They will be hauling telephone poles in and out of this site continually, and this is going to be a substantial noise and visual nuisance for any residential use. On the western border of the property is the very busy and very fast running traffic of the collector, Bill Bell Lane. Per the people who spoke at the planning commission, the traffic situation there is a great nuisance. We agree wholeheartedly! These nuisances, along with the odd shape of the property due to the bend in the road, make this site unsuitable for residential development. Had it been suitable for residential development, it would have obviously been left within the subdivision that was designed next door. But it wasn't...it was carved out because it wasn't suitable. The professional standard used by professional planners calls for adaptations to the conditions on the ground, and for the inclusion of **transitional zoning** between the single family and the industrial areas. This transitional use is a perfect custom fit.

- d) IF it was to be residential, the clear use for this land is multifamily. Multifamily has already been applied for and that use was rejected.
- e) Our proposal for a premium self storage facility will solve or mitigate all the problems that would be there with ANY other use.
- f) We propose to brick the entire side of the property which faces north as well as the areas facing the busy street to the west. In addition to that, we propose a green buffer to both the north and the south. In addition to the trees we will plant in that north section, we propose to plant a hedge of Eleagnus. I have planted these same plants beside my home in The Village at Hendrix. I'd welcome anyone to come by and look at this. In one year, they have grown really nicely, and they will be a solid 10-12' high screen in another year or two. We agree to use attractive "wrought iron" fencing across the front to complement an attractive landscape berm and planting beds to rival that of any upscale neighborhood.
- g) Regarding the C-2 zoning, we suggest that our approval be conditioned upon the recording of covenants that will run with the land, indicating that the site will be used as presented, and that, should the buildings be destroyed by any force of nature or man, they can only be replaced with the same material and for the same use. (This is a legitimate way of placing in stone any concerns for whether this would become a pharmacy or some other randomly selected use.) There is precedent that we have used covenants that were prescribed by the city in the past to make clarifications for the future. We can provide an example that was done just a few years ago in the City of Conway if needed.
- h) Security was another issue raised by one gentleman. His straw-man scenario referenced a crude, outdated system with no door alarms, which is only used by older, low-end operators. We use state of the art security systems which combine individual door alarms with high definition color cameras with night vision capabilities. Our security system is set up on a dialer which will alert our on-duty manager 24/7/365. If **any** door opens and the authorized user is not on site, we know it instantly, we check the cameras in real-time, and we can respond in seconds. Our sites are always manicured, attractive, clean, and tended to with conscientious care.

In summary, the professional standards for the science of planning call for adaptations to the conditions on the ground as they develop, and for the inclusion of transition zoning between the single family and the industrial areas. This transitional use is a perfect custom fit. This proposal is in the best interest of both the City of Conway AND the neighbors, based on what they said at the planning commission meeting. Almost all of the people who spoke against this project were NOT within the 200' area which receives the notices. Rather, they were all at least 1,000 feet away and some were 2,000 feet away. None of them were from anywhere even close to being within view of the property. None of the concerns voiced were debated by the planning commissioners other than a brief mention of item (g) above. There was no rebuttal. I genuinely don't feel that the project had a legitimate consideration at that segment of the approval process. When the merits of a proposal are not debated and considered, but rather, the cases appear to be simply voted on based on the number of people who show up for or against the project, it doesn't inspire confidence in the system.

We are grateful that our system offers the appeal opportunity to the City Council, and we rely upon and welcome your thoughtful consideration.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 0-99-95 AND ESTABLISHING AMENDED PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED PRIOR TO ANNEXATION OF PROPERTY TO THE CITY OF CONWAY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES:

Whereas, the City of Conway has, and continues to experience growth due to the annexation of property, and

Whereas, this growth places strains on the City resources to maintain and upgrade streets and drainage due to substandard development processes that burden Conway taxpayers, and

Whereas, Ordinance O-99-95 largely solved these problems but has unnecessarily limited annexations in certain cases;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS THAT ORDINANCE O-99-95 SHALL BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That no property shall be annexed to the City of Conway before it has been established in the annexing ordinance, directly or by reference, which portions of which existing streets within that property shall be accepted by the City as public streets for maintenance and which streets shall be recognized as public streets for the sole purpose of allowing the issuance of building permits.

Section 2: That no streets that are not specifically noted in the annexing ordinance or by reference as being accepted as a public street for maintenance or as a public street for the sole purpose of allowing issuance of building permits shall be maintained by the City, nor accepted as a public street until the City of Conway shall accept them as such by the passage of an appropriate ordinance.

Section 3: That, by means of voluntary annexation, no street within an area to be annexed shall be accepted as a public street for maintenance if created as a result of an illegal subdivision. Such determination shall be established in the annexation ordinance.

Section 4: That, by means of voluntary annexation, no property shall be annexed to the City of Conway if part of an illegal subdivision created after July 1, 1986. This shall be determined by evidentiary support of copies of deeds showing the property in its current configuration since July 1, 1986, by documentation showing the property arrived in its current configuration when not under the jurisdictional area of the Conway Subdivision Ordinance, or deed records showing the property and parent tract are both in excess of five (5) acres. Exceptions may be granted for parcels/lots or portions thereof where it can be determined by the Planning and Development Director or City Engineer and indicated in the annexation ordinance, that annexation would not result in subversion of the Conway Subdivision Ordinance or be necessary to address an immediate and urgent threat to the public health and welfare of the City of Conway.

Section 5: That for any petition for voluntary annexation, the Planning and Development Director or his/her designee shall, in writing and prior to the petition being heard by the Conway City Council, identify any barriers to development that may exist for the property under consideration.

Section 6: All ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Re: Annexation Ordinance

Mayor and Council Members,

Enclosed with this memo is an ordinance to amend the annexation review procedures for the city. The amendment comes as result of changes presented by the existing ordinance, O-99-95. City staff has seen increased demand for annexation in the last several years. The primary intent of the original ordinance was to prevent the annexation of illegally subdivided land. This practice had become a very costly problem in the late 90s, causing the to rebuild streets that hadn't been properly designed or constructed when illegally constructed. However, the ordinance has been unnecessarily restrictive for certain types of annexations.

The primary changes to the ordinance include simplifying review elements regarding platting compliance. The primary intent remains to prevent the annexation of illegal subdivisions. Additionally, the ordinance allows for the Planning Director or City Engineer to allow applications that do not meet the review criteria when it is clear the intent for annexation is not to subvert the requirements of the subdivision ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CONWAY ZONING CODE ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR TREE PLANTING FOR ALL NEW CONSTRUCTION OF SINGLE-FAMILY AND TWO-FAMILY/DUPLEX DWELLINGS:

Whereas, it is desirable to establish standards for the regulation of tree planting and include these regulations in the Conway Zoning Code; and

Whereas, The Conway Planning Commission has prepared amendments to the Conway Zoning Code, gave proper notice in accordance with Arkansas Code Annotated § 14-56-422, held a duly authorized public hearing on July 18th, 2022, and adopted the prepared amendments; and

Whereas, a committee consisting of city staff, members of the Conway Tree Board, and other stakeholder groups were formed to study the issue of tree preservation and develop recommendations; and

Whereas, this committee met and discussed adding this requirement in addition to others.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1. The Conway Zoning Code be amended as follows:

Section 601.30 TREE PLANTING FOR SINGLE-FAMILY AND TWO-FAMILY/DUPLEX DWELLINGS

The planting of at least one (1) tree with a minimum 1.5" diameter at breast height shall be

required for all new construction of single-family and two-family/duplex dwellings where no tree(s) exist on the parcel or lot. The tree shall be planted before the final Certificate of Occupancy for any single-family or two-family/duplex dwelling is issued. It shall be the responsibility of the Building Permits and Inspections Department to verify tree planting requirements are met prior to the release of a Certificate of Occupancy for any new singlefamily or two-family/duplex construction.

Section 2. The Planning and Development Department is hereby directed to develop a list of active homebuilders in the city and provide notice of this ordinance change, including educational resources for proper tree planting.

Section 3. That any ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Section 4. Given that it will take time for information to be disseminated to the public and homebuilders and time for homebuilders to adapt to the new requirement, this amendment shall not be effective until March 1st, 2023.

Whereas, the City of Conway, Arkansas has been awarded a total of \$12,333,839.00 in funding; such funding is to be received in two disbursements, and

Whereas, the City of Conway has received the initial funding in the amount of \$6,116,919.50, with the second installation scheduled to be received by September/October 2022; and

Whereas, the United States Department of Treasury has adopted guidelines regarding the use of ARPA funding; and

Whereas, the City has identified ten eligible projects for use by city departments for the ARPA funding.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1. The City of Conway shall approve the below project list for the ARPA funding:

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR EMPLOYEE BONUSES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES:

Whereas, the City Council appreciates the hard work and dedication of the employees of the City of Conway; and

Whereas, the City has received American Rescue Plan funding which may be used to provide premium pay to eligible workers; and

Whereas, the City of Conway wants to show gratitude for employees who have served with distinction during the COVID-19 pandemic.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: The City of Conway shall appropriate \$820,000 from the Grant Fund Balance Appropriation Account (399.000.4900) to the salary accounts for each department in order to provide a one-time bonus equal to a 3% cost of living adjustment for full-time employees and \$300 for part-time employees. To receive a bonus, employees must be hired prior to the last full pay period in July, 2022 and must be actively employed on the date of distribution. Employees pending termination will not receive a bonus. The bonus shall be distributed on August 12th, 2022.

Section 3. This ordinance is necessary for the protection of the public peace, health and safety; an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE BEAVERFORK LAKE BOAT DOCK SLIPS PROJECT, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Whereas, the City of Conway Parks & Recreation has a need to replace the boat dock slips at Beaverfork Lake; and

Whereas, due to the limited number of vendors, the City of Conway would like to procure this equipment through a Sourcewell Cooperative Contract; and

Whereas, a quote was provided for the dirt work from A&B Dirt Mowers to demolish, remove, and reconstructed the rock levee; and

Whereas, American Rescue Plan funding in the amount up to of \$550,000 would be used for this project.

Section 2. The City of Conway shall appropriate an amount not to exceed \$550,000 from the Grant Fund Balance Appropriation Account (399.000.4900) into the Parks & Recreation Account (399.140.5990)

Section 3. All ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Section 4. This ordinance is necessary for the protection of the public peace, health, and safety; an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR THE CITY OF CONWAY FIRE STATION #3 BUILDING; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FUNDING FOR THE LOWER RIDGE WATER PROJECT FOR CONWAY CORPORATION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES:

Whereas, O-85-11 amended by O-19-55 allows water mains to be extended outside the city limits In the Filed Water Plan; and

Whereas, The Lower Ridge Water Project includes 46 lots in the city and 38 lots outside the city and with current planned development has up to 300 potential customers; and

Whereas there is a need for safe, clean drinking water in this area for the protection of public health; and

Whereas, this project is an eligible expense for the American Rescue Funding the City received;

Whereas, Faulkner County Quorum court has agreed to pay \$1.57 million for out-of-city costs; and

Whereas, Conway Corporation will split in-city costs with the City of Conway; and

Whereas, this job will be managed by Conway Corporation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONWAY, ARKANSAS, THAT:

Section 1. The City of Conway shall appropriate funding in the amount not to exceed \$437,500 from the Grant Fund Balance Appropriation Account (399.000.4900) to the Grant Fund CIP – Building Account (399.131.5902) for the Lower Ridge Water Project. This project is from the Drainage/Stormwater project line item of the American Rescue funding.

Section 2. The mayor of Conway is authorized to pay an amount up to \$437,500 upon an invoice from Conway Corporation and is allowed to enter into an agreement and execute all documents associated with this project.

Section 3. All ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of the conflict.
