Dear Joe,

I am writing to give more detail about our previous discussions concerning a drainage easement on Tokusen property. Prior to 1989, there was a 35ft drainage easement that ran south along Thomas G. Wilson Drive. It continued south past William J. Clark approximately 600ft. At this point, the drainage easement turned East and was 20ft wide. It continued to flow east about 300ft until it exited our property and/or joined the ditch that generally separates Tokusen property and the Conway Commercial Warehousing land.

In 1991, Crist Engineers, Inc. (Little Rock, AR) designed a drainage catchment for Thomas G. Wilson Drive. This project was completed in 1992 and the water was re-directed around the NE Corner of the Tokusen site. The Tokusen site was re-graded by adding some 14ft of fill material on the east side. The drainage system for this area has proven to be sufficient.

The original drainage easements are still active and this appears to be an administrative oversight. As an abutting property owner, I am requesting your cooperation to resolve the issue. On behalf of Tokusen, I am petitioning the Conway City Council (Planning & Development) to abandon a portion of the easements on Tokusen property.

Please see the attached file(s) with a description of the easement to be vacated and a copy of our recent survey that highlights conflicts. I am requesting to close the portions that contain existing Tokusen building structures; whereby a drainage system is not practical.

I will be happy to address any questions you may have in this matter. And finally, I ask that you sign the Petition for Written Consent to Vacate these easements and the letter of concurrence. July 14 is my deadline to submit the application for consideration at the July 22 Council Meeting.

Richard Henley, on behalf of Compass Academy, has requested to allow the School Facilities use in the I-3 zone for property located at 225 Tilk Rd, with the following legal description:

LOT 5-A RUNWAY PARK SUB REPLAT & N ½ LOT 6 RUNWAY PARK SUB

The intent of the conditional use request is for the site to operate as a private school for Compass Academy with an adult education program for recent graduates of the school. The school currently hosts 127 K-12 students with 31 staff members and would hope to one day allow up to 250 students. The school operates from 7:00am-5:00pm year-round with 2 week breaks in May/Jun and Jul/Aug with regular holidays off.

School Facilities use is not allowed by right in the I-3 zone without a conditional use permit. The Comprehensive Plan designates the area as Light Industry. The I-3 district is designed primarily to provide a zone for those manufacturing and other industrial activities objectionable to business and residential uses by reason of operational characteristics and insulated from these uses by strips of less objectionable industry or natural barriers. This zone is intended to provide a place for manufacturing products from raw materials.

Adjacent area uses are industrial/commercial in nature and consist of the USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service Center to the north and Greenway Equipment to the south. Both sites have a CUP tied to them, in the form of Religious Activities with Daycare to the north (not being utilized) and Retail-High Impact: Farm Equipment Sales being utilized to the south. Directly west of the site's rear parking lot is a consulting office and Welsco, a distributor of welding supplies and industrial and specialty gases, to the southwest of the building.

Staff proposes the following conditions:

- 1. Operating hours will be limited to 7:00am to 5:00pm, Monday through Friday, year-round.
- 2. The property shall be subject to site development review in accordance with Article 10 of the Zoning Code, and the property shall be platted in accordance with the Conway Subdivision Ordinance prior to the issuance of building permits.
- 3. The proposed playground area must be enclosed by a 6-foot privacy fence. All newly installed chain link fencing shall be painted/coated. No razor or barbed wire will be allowed. All fencing types and placements shall be approved by Planning Staff prior to installation.

- 4. Any existing landscaped areas that are disturbed as a part of site development review must be replaced to comply with Article 10 of the Zoning Code.
- 5. Upon development review approval, any expansions or additions to the structure or outdoor play area, as well as any changes to the use shall require an amended or new conditional use permit.
- 6. Any new signage shall be permitted and installed in accordance with the Conway Sign Code.
- 7. No zoning variance, required as a result of the commencement of the conditional use, may be requested.
- 8. The conditional use approval shall become null and void if the use is not commenced within 18 months from the date of approval of this permit.
- 9. The conditional use permit shall expire if the use ceases for a consecutive period of greater than 18 months.

The Planning Commission reviewed the request at its regular meeting on July 21, 2025, and voted x-x that the request be forwarded to the City Council with a recommendation for approval.

Whereas, the committee recommends a 2% increase in base pay for all existing firefighter positions, excluding Firefighter Basic and Firefighter General; and

**Whereas,** the committee recommends that these increases be effective with the pay period beginning June 28, 2025, which marks the start of the second half of the City's 2025 pay period schedule.

**Section 1**. The City of Conway 2025 Uniform Fire Pay Scale shall be adopted in the format presented in Appendix A.

### AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CHANGES TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT PAY SCALE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

**Whereas,** an incentive pay structure has been adopted for the Fire Department which includes \$3,000 per year for bilingual abilities; and

Whereas, the Police Department also has an incentive pay structure which includes additional monies for bilingual abilities; and

**Whereas,** the Police Department pay scale authorizes \$750 per year for the bilingual incentive, and the City Council wishes to make the Police Department pay scale match the Fire Department pay scale as it relates to the bilingual incentive.

**Section 1:** The City of Conway Police Department Pay Scale shall be amended to authorize \$3,000 per year for the bilingual incentive.
